

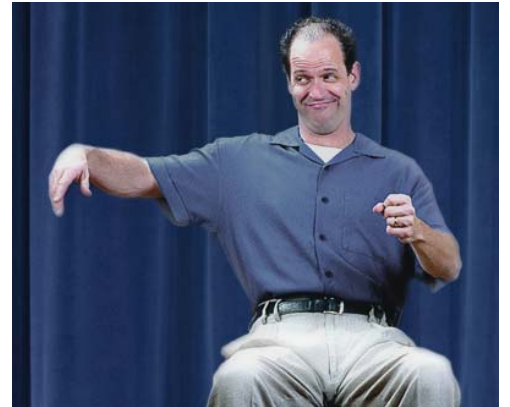


"Choose Character Over Bullying"

Whether about students who are bullying in ignorance of how they are acting, or about the more serious staunch bullies, Cary's message speaks to the heart of every student.

- * Cary relates the painful consequences of **physical, social, and online "cyber" bullying**.
- * Cary effectively exposes the **self-centered attitude** of bullying, and the desire for some bullies to **be somebody**, defining for the audience why kids bully while subliminally exposing the immaturity of it.
- * He encourages the bullied, giving them helpful and practical advice.
- * Cary gives special emphasis to **cyber-bullying in middle and high school assemblies, inspiring students about the value and importance of confronting their friends who are committing such actions**.
- * He encourages **protecting** the bullied and **reporting** bullying when being a witness to it.
- * Cary culminates his message with his very positive "Three Chairs" *Peer Leadership* talk about being the kind of peer who is a magnet for friends—**unselfish and giving**.
- ** The above aspects are tailored and discussed in assemblies with varying depth from school to school, depending on each school's interest.



Cary Trivanovich has performed and spoken at over 3000 schools and youth conferences throughout virtually every state across America, and has spoken to kids and teens about bullying since long before bullying came to the forefront of concern in America's schools.
